PETS: Pet licenses are due by June 30<sup>th</sup>. . If you have a dog or cat that is not licensed, the City can impose a fine of \$10.00. The cost to obtain a license is only \$3.00. Please bring in the proof of the rabies vaccination. Per City Ordinance, you must keep your dog and cat on a leash when it is out of your yard. You are responsible if barking disturbs your neighbors, if your pet gets into gardens or flowerbeds and for collecting pet waste when you take your pet for a walk. Your neighbors may not enjoy your pet as much as you do. Please be a responsible pet owner.

**SEVERE WEATHER SEASON:** Tornado season is just around the corner. It's a good idea to have a battery operated radio, a cell phone, flashlight and a safe place to ride out the storm. The sirens at the fire station, water tower and the City Park will sound when bad weather or high winds are in the area. You need to keep an eye on the TV or listen to the radio for specific information. We have purchased a new siren for the park.

GOLF CARTS: Golf Carts will be allowed to be operated on city streets by persons possessing a valid operator's license. NO KIDS DRIVING GOLF CARTS. A golf cart shall not be operated on a city street which is a primary road extension through the city (such as Hwy 75) but shall be allowed to cross such a street. Golf carts shall be equipped with a "slow moving vehicle" sign and a bicycle safety flag and operate on the streets only from sunrise to sunset. Such carts shall be equipped with adequate brakes and shall meet any other safety measure as required by the State of Iowa.

JUST TO INFORM YOU ALL: The City has contracted with the Woodbury County Sheriff for law enforcement needs. If you have an emergency, call 911. If you have a non-emergency situation but need to contact the sheriff's office, the number is 712-279-6510.

We also have an agreement with a property inspection co (Absolute Inspection Services) to utilize their property inspection services. Their inspector will be canvassing Sloan periodically and sending out nuisance abatement letters. If you receive a nuisance abatement letter, please take care of the problem as soon as possible to avoid paying a hefty fine.

## **SLOAN MUSEUM NEWS:**

The Museum is open each Saturday from 10:00 to 12:00 during the summer, and upon special requests. Visitors who stop by are in for a real treat. We have many displays and some great Sloan history, along with unique farm exhibits. You will find photographs, artifacts, school history and more. We are finding that more and more people are doing away with their land line phones and just using their cell phones. We need a phone number for the utility billing in case we have to contact you. So if you have gone from using a land line phone to strictly using a cell phone, please call us at 428-3348 and update that information.

Just a reminder, please do not use the recycling bins over by Highway 75 as trash disposals - they are for recyclables ONLY and if you are caught depositing your trash in these, there could be a \$500.00 fine imposed! Do not put glass or Styrofoam in these containers! If you are not sure what is recyclable, stop into the City Hall and we will give you a list of items.

If you are interested in a pink recycling cart, the City has some on hand. You can purchase one for \$58.00 and one of our maintenance guys will deliver it to you.

As per Iowa DNR regulations, all cities have to publish an annual water quality report. The 2016 report will be available in June at the City Hall, published in the local paper and posted in public places. You will also be able to access it on the website at <a href="http://iowaccr.org/Sloan">http://iowaccr.org/Sloan</a>. If you have questions about it, please do not hesitate to give us a call.

We have a wonderful City Park for all children and adults to enjoy. New play equipment is being considered for purchase...slide and swings. <u>BUT</u>, we have a problem with people throwing trash on the ground throughout the park instead of putting it in the trash containers. Please help us keep our City Park clean.

<u>Please don't put your grass clippings in the street!</u> When you mow, please mow the first two or three swaths so the grass blows into your yard. The grass clippings in the street get washed down the storm drains when we have heavy rains. This can cause the storm drains to get plugged and therefore the rain water can't get away as fast as it should. Also, this can cause water to backup into your basement! (Sloan has an ordinance against putting debris in the street).

If you are still pumping water out of your basement, pump it to the storm drain in the street. **DO NOT PUMP IT DOWN YOUR BASEMENT DRAIN!**Not only are you are violating our Ordinance when you do this, but you are overloading our sewer system. This also causes backup in other resident's basements. Sloan will be implementing a sump pump inspection program for improperly connected sump pumps. You will receive a detailed letter about this and a time frame in which every house will be inspected.

Here's something else you may not have known: We have been having a problem with wipes such as clorox, baby or cleaning wipes plugging the pumps at the lift station on Cedar St. Please do not flush those items down your toilet. Even though wipes are considered biodegradable, they don't dissolve immediately so they could plug your own sewer line.

Grass Pile hours are Tuesday and Thursday from 5:00 to 7:00 PM and Saturday from 1:00 to 4:00 PM.

Doing outside summer projects? Adding on to your house or garage or maybe just building a storage shed, deck or gazebo?? Remember to get a building permit prior to outside construction projects. Building permit forms are available at City Hall.

Doing some landscaping or planting trees? Do not plant trees in the parking. Call 1-800-292-8989 before doing any digging!
